Short introductory bio

Dr. Raphael W. Bostic took office June 5, 2017, as the 15th president and chief executive officer of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta. He is responsible for all the Bank's activities, including monetary policy, bank supervision and regulation, and payment services. In addition, he serves on the Federal Reserve's chief monetary policy body, the Federal Open Market Committee. The Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta serves the Sixth Federal Reserve District, which covers Alabama, Georgia, and Florida, and parts of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Tennessee. The Bank has branches in Birmingham, Jacksonville, Miami, Nashville, and New Orleans.

Short introductory talking points

- As president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta, Raphael Bostic is a participant on the Federal Reserve's monetary policy-setting Federal Open Market Committee and votes every third year. He represents the Southeast region of the US, which covers Florida, Georgia, Alabama, and parts of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Tennessee.
- Before moving to the South for the first time in 2017, Bostic was a professor at the University of Southern California, served as an assistant secretary of the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, and was previously an economist at the Federal Reserve Board of Governors.
