The main message

- Immigration contributes to the vitality of American communities in several ways.
 - Boosting demand for locally-produced goods and services – including housing.
 - Changing the decision calculus for firms that have the option to relocate production abroad.
 - Civic contributions: stabilizing neighborhoods, serving communities.


Boosting the local housing market

Stage 1: immigration and economic opportunity

- Conventional wisdom: immigrants "take" American jobs.
- Assumption underlying conventional wisdom: there is a fixed number of American jobs to be had.
- Problems with that assumption:
 - American jobs can and have been relocated overseas.
 - In many industries, the amount of work to be done depends on the size of the population served.

Outside the manufacturing sector

- Service sector: number of jobs increases with population.
 - Retail
 - Health care
 - Education
- Construction/consumer durables: number of jobs depends on population growth rate.
- Job creation: the rate of self-employment among immigrants is 3x the rate for natives.

Stage 2: Attracting natives

- In a zero-sum world, the arrival of immigrants would drive natives away.
- In reality, the arrival of 1,000 new immigrants is associated with an increase in the nativeborn population.
 - +150 attributable to childbearing by immigrants.
 - +270 attributable to the arrival of more natives.

Stage 3: The Housing Market

- A positive impact of immigration on housing prices is a simple story of supply and demand.
- Where is the positive impact being felt? Is immigration exacerbating affordability problems?




NYC Narratives

- NYC prospers in the era of legal immigration (through 1920).
- Restricted immigration era (1920-1965)
 - African-American migration 1920s, early 1960s.
 - Puerto Rican migration 1940s, 1950s.
 - Population stagnation and decline towards the end of the period – 1975 fiscal crisis accompanies.
- New era of immigration (1965-present)
 - Native-born population of NYC continues to decline.
 - Immigration leads to new population highs.
 - Quality of life indicators improve crime rate.

NYC Narratives

- Morrisania, the Bronx
 - Hard-hit area in the crisis years. Population declines, rampant drug abuse/HIV infection, high crime as recently as 1990.
 - Now the fastest growing neighborhood in the borough, 16,000 immigrants from the Caribbean, Africa.
- Canarsie, Brooklyn
 - White flight in the 1990s.
 - Population trends reversed by Caribbean immigration; neighborhood has both lower real estate costs and lower poverty than the city average.





Implications for reform proposals

- For 11 million undocumented immigrants, the difference between finding a way to keep them and sending them home:
 - 500,000 manufacturing jobs
 - More than \$1 trillion in housing wealth.
- Expanding legal inflows by 100,000 per year:
 - 4,600 manufacturing jobs per year.
 - \$80 billion in housing wealth per year.
