

15-County Area Characteristics

- Contains 1/3 of the state's 4.6 M population (1.5M)
- 11 of the 15 counties designated as persistently poor; contained within Congressman Jim Clyburn's I-95 Corridor
- · 2 out of every 5 residents are African-American -vs- 1 out of 3 residents in the state

15- County Area Characteristics

- · 1 out of every 3 residents are poor
- · Contains at least 108K acres of HP
- Contains almost 40% of the states
 13.1M forested acres
- Contains some of the best soil for growing pine trees


